Joplin Schools to mark one-year anniversary of May 22, 2011 tornado with groundbreaking ceremonies

Joplin, MO - On Tuesday, May 22, 2012, Joplin Schools will mark the one-year anniversary of the May 22 tornado with groundbreaking ceremonies to celebrate the rebuilding of Joplin Schools. On May 22, 2011, an EF5 tornado cut a path of destruction through one-third of the city of Joplin. The losses were staggering: 161 people died and more than 8000 homes and businesses were wiped out. Joplin Schools lost seven students and one staff member. Half of the school district's buildings were damaged or destroyed including the only high school. Within hours of the tornado, the story changed from destruction to hope. Neighbors helped neighbors. Joplin residents united in rescue and recovery efforts. And, thousands of volunteers from across the world poured in to lend a helping hand. On Tuesday, May 22, 2012, the story of hope continues as Joplin Schools celebrates Operation Rising Eagle, the rebuilding of schools destroyed in the May 22, 2011 tornado, and honors those who helped make hope possible.
